# Von Stiehl Winery boasts two kinds of spirits

Ghost Fox Valley Hunters spent two nights at the Von Stiehl Winery in Algoma looking for spirits of a different kind and plan to reveal their findings from 10 a.m. to 1 p.m. on Nov. 10.

The von Stiehl building was originally a brewery built in 1868. The business was sold in 1879 to Henry Schmiling, the great-great-great-great uncle of the current owners Aric and Brad Schmiling. The brewery went out of business, and after many years of various uses the building was purchased and restored in the 1960s by Dr. Charles Stiehl to be used as a winery. Stiehl later changed his name to von Stiehl.

Valley Ghost Fox Hunters, a seven-member nonprofit group, investigates up to 17 ghostly happenings a year, mainly in Wisconsin and Michigan's Upper Peninsula .

According to Sallie Marquardt, retail man-ager at von Stiehl, over the years people have seen apparitions in the women's bathroom, a board fall out of nowhere in the tasting room, smooth river stones that turn up in odd places, people being shoved and hair pulled, and odd waxv smudges on mirrors around the building.

The most "awesome" thing that happened during the investigation was when the group was in one of the storage rooms above the distribution center, Nehring.

He and others were asking the spirits questions when they heard the floor creaking. When Nehring asked if his questions were making the spirit mad, a door slammed narrowly missing his shoulder.

"We even tried to recreate it, and we couldn't," he said.

The group also recorded what appears to be ghost appearing in a doorway for just a second. Nehring had several other paranormal groups check the recording to see if someone from his team was casting a shadow. It wasn't a shadow.

"Very rarely does anyone get any sort of shadow or movement," he said.

The unveiling of evidence will take place from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. Nov. 10 at von Stiehl, 115 Navarino St., Algoma.
